What your child will learn about this term and how you can help at home

What we will be learning this term...


English

This term, Year 6 will read at a range of fiction and nonfiction books. They will read Windrush Child and The Man who Walked Between the Towers to support their writing.

Grammar: This term, children will learn to use expanded noun phrases to give complicated information concisely.

They will learn to use semi-colons, colons and dashes to mark independent clauses and hyphens in words. They will learn to use the perfect form of verbs and passive verbs.

Spelling: The children will learn to spell words with 'silent' letters (e.g.



How you can help: Ensure your child reads at home everyday. Encourage your child to read different books and use these to inspire their writing. Practise letter joins when writing sentences. Help your child learn the spellings sent home for homework.

Computing

Digital Literacy and Computer Science: This term, the children will learn how to edit a photo. They will learn how to build a data set and use formulas on the data.

Maths

The children will learn the following:

- Solve addition and subtraction problems
- Solve multiplication and division problems
- Convert between units of time
- Add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions
- Multiply decimals by whole numbers
- Plot shapes on a co-ordinate grid
- Draw shapes accurately using a ruler and protractor
- Identify shapes from their nets
- Use an algebraic rule
- Solve equations
- Use formulae
- Draw line graphs and pie charts
- To read a scale accurately
- Solve ratio and proportion problems

Science

Animals including humans: This term, children will learn to name and identify the main parts of the circulatory system. They will learn the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood.



They will learn about the impact that diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle have on the way bodies function.

History Historical study of London:

Year 6 will focus on how London changed after World War 2 and the causes of these changes. They will describe life in post-war London and evaluate the effect it had on

people. Children will examine key events in this period, such as the festival of Britain, and they will consider how the lives of women changed.



Geography Geographical study of

London: Children will examine the ways that London was rebuilt after World War Two. They will use maps to identify areas destroyed by the blitz and conduct fieldwork to see how the local area was rebuilt. Children will learn to use computer mapping and compass points to support their fieldwork.

Art

Printing: This term, the children will learn to transfer images to a press print surface and will learn how to screen print.

Collage: This term, the children will learn a variety of stitching techniques to create a sea scape.

Design Technology

Textiles: Children will create their own bag.

Cooking: Children will learn to shape, assemble and heat war time recipes.

Music

This term Y6 will learn about famous composers.

Gymnastics: The children will develop their own performances with a focus on counter balance.

Athletics: The children will work on coaching each other to help develop their skills.

Religious Education

What do people believe about life after death?:

The children will learn about what different religions believe about the purpose of life and life after death.

PSHE

Living in the Wider World: The children will learn about the different responsibilities they have. They will learn about money, including loans and debt. Children will consider the impact of anti-social behaviour and how differences can be resolved.

How can I help at home?

Make it clear that you value homework – set aside a specific time and area for your child to work on their homework.

Make sure your child **reads for 20 minutes** every day and ask them questions about the text to help their understanding.

Encourage your child to **re-tell the story** they have just read.

Help them to practise their multiplication and division facts.

Help your child practise their spellings each week.

Help your child to be organised:

- Is your completed homework in there too? Collected on Tuesday
