

### Health advice regarding: Flu, COVID-19 and Strep A

The government has issued advice for parents about the rise in children aged 0—14 years being admitted to hospital with flu. Their advice is that any child with a fever should stay at home and not attend



school until the fever (high temperature 38C or more) has passed and they feel well enough to be in school.

Children with mild symptoms such as a runny nose sore throat, or mild cough, who are otherwise well should still attend school. Please phone the school office and let us know if your child is not well enough to come into school. Thank you for your help with this.

#### Cost of living crisis

Camden Council have a cost of living crisis fund. They are able to give some help to families who are in severe hardship or financial crisis

You need to be resident in Camden for more than 6 weeks.

You need to be able to show evidence (possibly a bank statement) that you are in severe hard-ship or financial crisis.
